
Investigator's Meeting - highlights

- Adherence initial procedure
 - Proportion adherent to assigned platelet threshold at first included procedure = 93%
- Adherence subsequent procedures
 - Number of subsequent procedures = 1,586
 - Proportion adherent to assigned platelet threshold = 95%



Investigator's Meeting – highlights

- Site presentations
 - Kettering General Hospital
 - Research nurses cover whole day (7:30-18:00) over two shifts
 - Local QR code 'referral scheme' sends direct email to research nurses



Investigator's Meeting – highlights

- Site presentations
 - St Thomas' Hospital
 - Master screening log maintained locally
 - Monitors all patients on unit/s and their eligibility for all studies

- T4P daily screening log maintained
- Records daily checks of platelet results for all patients
- Colour coordinated to highlight if platelets <50 or 50-100, etc.

Investigator's Meeting – feedback

- Group working feedback
 - Encourage all staff to get involved in research 'it's their job'
 - Research incorporated into GMC/NMC guidelines and it is our role to allow patients access to research
 - Educating clinical team on rationale for study including harms of platelet transfusions
 - Don't let delays in accessing platelets hinder randomisation
 - Promote to clinical teams that T4P is about platelets for ICU
 procedures they can have platelets for other reasons outside trial

Investigator's Meeting – feedback

- Group working feedback
 - Importance of clinicians starting conversations with families with 'this is a research active unit..' or 'your relative may become suitable for a research study during their time on ICU..' and include this in your generic ICU information booklet for families
